

HELPFUL REMINDERS:

- **EMERGENCY NUMBERS:**
 - Police: dial 122
 - Ambulance: dial 123
- Exchange currencies at the airport for the best rate.
- Visas are available upon arrival.
[Cash Only, 25USD]
- Download the Uber app. Especially for airport pick-up.
[Use Code: annabellec4 for a Free Ride]
- Ditch the stroller. Most walkways are narrow and uneven. Opt for a carrier if you must.
- Skip the group tour. You'll get a lot more done on your own.
- Many attractions close at 5pm. Plan to arrive and visit early to avoid crowds.
- Avoid paying excessive camera fees at attractions. Keep your camera hidden. Use your phone or a discreet action camera. Most travelers do.
- At the market: pay 50% or less than the original given price. Be ready to negotiate. DO NOT follow seller "to the back".
